The Chief Economist and Deputy Director of UNU-WIDER Tony Addison will give a presentation based on a major new UNU-WIDER open access book Extractive industries: The management of resources as a driver of sustainable development. The presentation will focus on the growing role and importance of oil and gas and mining in developing countries, as well as the risks and uncertainties associated with this trend.

The event gathers together national and international academics, policy makers, government officials and development partners to discuss the developmental role of the extractive industry and to share insights on how the natural gas discoveries could lead to inclusive growth in Mozambique.

About the Inclusive Growth in Mozambique programme

The central goal of this collaborative programme is to support inclusive growth in Mozambique – growth that substantially improves the living standards of the country's population over the long term.

To address ongoing challenges and make real progress, two Mozambican institutions – the Ministry of Economy and Finance, and the University Eduardo Mondlane – joined forces with two institutions with extensive international networks and experience: UNU-WIDER and the University of Copenhagen. Together the four partner institutions have decades of experience in generating the evidence necessary for effective policy-formulation and capacity-building. Joint efforts are carried out with the aim of increasing analytical capabilities and strengthening policy-making in the country. Through the programme, partners work to seize new opportunities, scale-up past efforts, and support major broad-based impact on the welfare of the Mozambican people.
